

Preparations

Prepare the required parts for each installation method before starting the installation.

Installation method	Description of installation method
Mount the camera on the two-gang junction box using the attachment plate (accessory).	[Type 1]
Directly mount the camera onto the ceiling using the attachment plate (when wiring can be installed in the ceiling).	[Type 2]
Mount the camera onto the ceiling using the base bracket (accessory) (when conduits are used for wiring, or when there is no space available for wiring in the ceiling).	[Type 3]
Install by combining WV-Q187 (mount bracket) with WV-Q185 or WV-Q122A (wall mount bracket).	[Type 4]

IMPORTANT:



- Turn off each system's power supply (PoE hub, etc.) before starting the installation.
- [Type 1] [Type 2] [Type 3]**
 - Procure 4 screws (M4) to secure the base bracket or the attachment plate to a ceiling.
 - The minimum required pull-out capacity of a single screw or anchor bolt is 539 N [121 lbf] or more.
 - Select screws according to the material of the location that the camera will be mounted to. In this case, wood screws and nails should not be used.
 - If the mounting location such as plaster board is too weak to support the total weight, the area shall be sufficiently reinforced.
- [Type 4]**
 - For further information about the fixing screw and the anchor bolt, refer to the manual of each bracket.

Preparation for cable connection **X8570**

When using the alarm I/O cable or the audio input cable, remove the cable case fixed by 4 screws at the upper side of the camera and pull out the alarm I/O cable and the audio input cable stored inside.

IMPORTANT:


- Alarm I/O cable / Audio input cable with the ferrite core (accessory) must be used for EMS (Electromagnetic Susceptibility). (Refer to the right illustration)



Remove the cap for the female thread for the conduit


When using the conduit on the ceiling for wiring, remove the cap for the female thread for the conduit by using a hexagon wrench (ISO 2936, width across flats S=5 mm [3/16 inches] · locally procured).

The female thread for conduit is compliant with ANSI NPSM (parallel pipe threads) 3/4 or ISO 228-1 (parallel pipe threads) G3/4.



Installation


The installation tasks are explained using 5 steps.




Remove the camera using the reverse order of the installation procedures.

Step 1 Fixing the brackets (Install the attachment bracket and the base bracket) *There are 4 methods to install the camera to a ceiling or wall.

- Attach the attachment plate (accessory) so that the marking (PGYE1054) faces toward the ceiling to be installed.




- [Type 2] Directly mount the camera to the ceiling using the attachment plate.** Align the "FRONT" direction of the template A (accessory) with the desired direction (direction of Panasonic logo on the camera when installing a camera), bore holes for screws or anchors on the ceiling, and holes for wiring (ø25.4 mm [ø1 inch] as occasion demands. Then, fix the attachment plate.



- [Type 3] Mount the camera to a ceiling using base bracket (accessory).**

① Using the template B (accessory), make screw holes for fixing the base bracket and wiring holes.
The base bracket can be fixed in any of the following 5 screwing positions according to ceiling and wall conditions. Match the hole used when installing the camera to any of positions A to D, F.




- ¹ Select any of the two wiring holes of template B (accessory) when installing the base bracket.
- ² When installing the camera, do not use Position E.

- [Type 4] Install on a wall by combining WV-Q187 (optional mount bracket) with WV-Q185 or WV-Q122A (optional wall mount bracket).**

① Install the attachment plate (accessory) onto WV-Q187 using the fixing screws for the attachment plate (4 pcs.) (accessory). (Recommended tightening torque: 0.78 N·m [0.58 lbf·ft])
② Fix at the installation place by combining each bracket.


* Refer to the manual of each bracket for how to attach the bracket.

- ② Mount the attachment plate and the base bracket.**
-<When using the conduit on the ceiling for wiring>
-<When drilling a hole through the ceiling for wiring>



IMPORTANT:


- If open wiring is conducted, be sure to use conduits and run the cables inside the tubes to protect the cables from direct sunlight.
- Installation work shall be such that there is no exposure to water into the architecture through the conduits having been joined.



Step 1 Fixing the brackets (Attach the safety wire)


[1] In the case of [Type 1][Type 2] and [Type 3], attach the wire lug plate (accessory) on the ceiling by following the instructions below. (In the case of [Type 4], go to [2].)

- Bore a hole near the position where the camera is to be installed to fix the wire lug plate.
* The illustration on the right shows the available range for fixing the wire lug plate for the camera installation.
- Fix the wire lug plate with an M6 bolt-nut or anchor (locally procured).
Minimum pull-out strength: 724 N {163 lbf}



[2] Attach the safety wire to the wire lug plate.

<In the case of [Type 1], [Type 2] and [Type 3] >
Attach the hook for the safety wire of the camera to the wire hook section of the wire lug plate.



<In the case of [Type 4] >


Attach the hook for the safety wire of the camera to the wire hook section of WV-Q185 or WV-Q122A (option).

Note:

- When the safety wire is not long enough to reach the hook, use the extended safety wire (accessory).



Step 2 Making connections




[1] Connect an Ethernet cable (category 5e or better, straight) to RJ45 network cable. * The maximum cable length is 100 m {328 feet}.

IMPORTANT:

- If the procedure for the RJ45 waterproof connector (accessory) part is not correctly followed, the waterproofing may be compromised. Do not install the camera where the RJ45 waterproof connector is exposed to constant rain or moisture.
- The external dimensions of the Ethernet cable are from $\phi 5$ mm [$\phi 3/16$ inches] to $\phi 6.5$ mm [$\phi 1/4$ inches].

- First pass the Ethernet cable through the RJ45 waterproof connector cap (accessory) and then through the RJ45 waterproof connector cover (accessory). Next, use a specialized tool (locally procured) to crimp the RJ45 plug (locally procured) to the end of the Ethernet cable.
 - Take care not to remove the rubber parts from inside the RJ45 waterproof connector cover.
- Insert the RJ45 plug into the RJ45 waterproof jack connected to the camera.
- Connect the RJ45 waterproof connector cover to the




- Connect the RJ45 waterproof connector cover until the "←" marks align.
- Connect the RJ45 waterproof connector cap to the RJ45 waterproof connector cover and rotate the RJ45 waterproof connector cap until there is no gap between it and the RJ45 waterproof connector cover.

IMPORTANT:

- When removing the RJ45 waterproof connector, be sure to loosen the RJ45 waterproof connector cap first, rotate the RJ45 waterproof connector cover in the direction opposite to the attaching direction, and remove it. (If the RJ45 waterproof connector cover is removed when the "←" mark of the RJ45 waterproof connector cover is aligned with the "▶" mark of the RJ45 waterproof jack, the RJ45 waterproof jack may be damaged)

[2] If needed, connect the 4P alarm cable (accessory). (X8570)



Note:


- The default of external I/O terminals is "Off". Refer to the Operating Instructions on the provided CD-ROM for further information about the external I/O terminal settings.

[3] If needed, connect a microphone or the line out of an external device to the audio input cable. (X8570)

[4] Adequate waterproof treatment is required for the cables when installing the camera with cables exposed. (X8570)


The camera body is waterproof, but the cable ends, inside the base bracket (accessory) are not waterproof. Apply waterproof treatment on the connecting part as shown below.

<Waterproof treatment for other cables than the Ethernet cable>



IMPORTANT:


- Stretch the tape by approx. twice (see the illustration) and wind it around the cable. Insufficient tape stretch causes insufficient waterproofing.



Step 3 Mount the camera

[1] Align the 4 attachment mounting screws at the bottom of the camera with the holes in the attachment plate (accessory), and mount the camera.

Align the center of the Panasonic logo on the camera with the "I" mark on the left side of the WV-Q187 (option) and insert the camera. Then, temporary fix the camera by rotating it around 15° to the "I" mark on the right.



[2] Loosen 4 dome cover fixing screws using the bit (accessory), and remove the dome cover from the camera.

IMPORTANT:

- Dome cover is fixed to the camera body by the installed auxiliary wire, so please do not remove it.
- The dome cover is not fixed temporarily. Take care not to hit the dome cover against periphery


[3] Remove the protective packagings (2 pcs.) from the camera units.

[4] Shift camera 2 to the arrow direction by 2 scales (30°) shown on the illustration on the right by referring to <How to adjust the horizontal (PAN) angle> on the right side of STEP 5 in this document.

[5] Put camera 2 back to the original position after fixing the camera using the camera fixing screw.

IMPORTANT:

- Be sure to tighten the camera fixing screw. Failure to observe this may cause camera trouble due to camera falling. (Recommended tightening torque: 0.78 N·m {0.58 lbf·ft})



Step 4 Preparation for adjustment

[1] Insert an SD memory card into the SD slot, if necessary.

- Refer to the "Important Information" on the provided CD-ROM for how to insert/remove the SD memory card.

[2] Confirm the position of the camera 4 and remove the direction sheet.

[3] Insert the Wi-Fi USB adapter (locally procured) to the USB port (for installation constructor) and then turn on the power of the camera. (The Wi-Fi USB adapter is used only at the time of the installation/servicing.)

* When not using the Wi-Fi USB adapter (when adjusting using a PC directly connected with an Ethernet cable), connect the camera to the network by referring to "Configure the network settings" of the Important Information (on the provided CD-ROM). Display the "Easy Installation" tab of "Easy Setup" from the menu of the camera and then go to "Step 5 Adjustment".

Be sure to use a Wi-Fi USB adapter that is checked its operability by Panasonic. Refer to the Panasonic support website below for operation check information of Wi-Fi USB adapter.

[4] Select "Wi-Fi" from the setting of a tablet or smart phone and then connect with the Wi-Fi USB adapter (to be locally procured) attached to the camera.

Refer to the manual of the Wi-Fi USB adapter and device in use for how to connect them.



[5] Launch the browser on a tablet or smart phone and then enter the following URL to connect with the camera main unit.

[6] The initial screen of the camera will be displayed on the tablet's or smart phone's browser.




Step 5 Adjustment *For details of adjustment and case examples, refer to the Panasonic support website (<https://security.panasonic.com/support/info/> <Control No.: C0115>).

* As an example, the explanation is provided using a Wi-Fi USB adapter. When adjusting using a directly connected PC, refer to "Easy Installation" of the operating Instructions (on the Panasonic support web site).

[1] Select an installation condition of the camera.

- Select a layout for capturing images according to the installation place of the camera. Select one of "360 deg. view" (installing the cameras 1-4 horizontally) or "270 deg. + right below view" (installing the camera 4 facing downward) in the displayed initial screen. When [Next] is clicked after the selection, the following screen will be displayed according to the selected content.



When selecting "360 deg. view"

When selecting "270 deg. + right below view"

- The setup menu will be displayed when the [Setup menu] button (A) on the top right of the screen is clicked. Use of the pull-down menu (B) on the top of the setup menu can switch selection between "360 deg." and "270 deg. + right below". To close the setup menu, click the [Close] button (C) on the bottom of the setup menu.

- Use of the pull-down menu (D) on the bottom center of the screen can switch the camera to display images. (Cam. 1-4/ Cam. 1/ Cam. 2/ Cam. 3/ Cam. 4)

[2] Adjust the angle of the camera.

- When "270 deg. + right below view" (camera 4 is installed with the shooting direction downward) is selected, turn the direction of camera 4 vertically downward by referring to <How to adjust the vertical (TILT) angle> on the right side of this document.
- Referring to <How to adjust the horizontal (PAN) angle> on the right side of this document, adjust the horizontal (PAN) angle of camera 2 so that the camera 2 faces the center of the screen to be shot.
- Adjust the horizontal (PAN) angle of cameras 1, 3 and 4 to eliminate dead angle in the shooting range.
- If necessary, adjust the TILT (vertical) angle and the YAW (inclination) angle of each camera by referring to the adjustment method shown on the right.
- If necessary, repeat steps ② to ④ to adjust the direction of each camera.

Note:

- To display or hide the auxiliary line on the screen, select 1-screen display and click the [Cross line display] button (E) referring to [3] -① described below. The auxiliary line helps to check the horizontal and verticality of the displayed image.
- When selecting "270 deg. + right below view", in order to eliminate dead angle in the shooting range, set the vertical (TILT) angle of the camera 1, 2, and 3 between +30° and +65°, and the vertical (TILT) angle of the camera 4 as close as possible to that of the camera 2 (in the minus direction).

[3] Adjust the zoom and focus. (S8530)

* Depending on the YAW (inclination) angle, adjustment using the auxiliary handle may be difficult. In such a case, adjust zoom and focus first, then adjust the YAW (inclination) angle again.

* To eliminate dead angle in the shooting range, set the zoom to the WIDE end (x1).

- Click and select a camera to be adjusted from the screens of cameras 1-4 that are displayed on "360 deg. view" or "270 deg. + right below view" to display the screen on 1-screen. (To return to 4-screen, use the pull-down menu (D) on the bottom center of the screen.)
- When the handle part of the auxiliary handle is pushed by a finger, the knob side of the auxiliary handle will rise up. Remove the auxiliary handle by pulling it out to the arrow direction as shown on the illustration on the right and then attach it to the zoom lock knob.

[3] Loosen the zoom lock knob to which the auxiliary handle is attached by rotating counterclockwise, and move the handle between TELE and WIDE to acquire an appropriate angle of view. Then, tighten the zoom lock knob by rotating clockwise.

[4] Remove the auxiliary handle from the zoom lock knob and then attach it to the focus lock knob provided at the back of the knob mark.

[5] Display the "FOCUS ADJUSTMENT" screen (see the illustration on the right) by clicking the [Focus assist] button (E) displayed on the bottom right of the screen.

[6] Loosen the focus lock knob to which the auxiliary handle is attached by rotating counterclockwise, and move the handle in front and behind of the focused position. The optimal focus position will be automatically recorded as the "PEAK HOLD" position.

[7] When the Focus lock knob is moved, the current focus position will be indicated on "INDICATOR". Adjust the focus position so that the indicator value goes close to the "PEAK HOLD" position.

[8] When the indicator value goes to the best focus position, "BEST FOCUS" will be displayed in reverse at the lower right corner of the screen.

[9] Tighten the focus lock knob so as to fix the best focus position.

[10] If necessary, repeat steps ③ to ⑩ to adjust and determine the angle of view and the focus.


[11] Exit the "FOCUS ADJUSTMENT" screen by clicking the [Focus assist] button (E).

[12] When the adjustment is completed, remove the auxiliary handle and return it to the camera main body. To store the auxiliary handle to the original position, execute step ② above in the reverse order.

[4] Remove the Wi-Fi USB adapter. (In the case of using a Wi-Fi USB adapter)

IMPORTANT:

- Be sure to remove the Wi-Fi USB adapter.



The following explanation is an example of how to adjust camera 2. The adjustment angle described below is when all the cameras are in their factory-set positions. The adjustable angle of each camera varies according to the positional relationship with other cameras.

- Be careful not to touch the lens part of the camera during the adjustment.
- Depending on the adjusted position of each camera unit, the Wi-Fi USB adapter may be seen in the screen.

<How to adjust the horizontal (PAN) angle>


Hold and move the PAN adjustment knob to change the direction of each camera unit.

Camera 1-4 : ±30° (when each camera is in the factory-set position)

Notch interval : 2.5°

Note:

- 360° horizontal (PAN) movement of each camera is available by moving each camera unit in order.




<How to adjust the vertical (TILT) angle>

Hold and move the camera unit to change the direction of each camera unit.

Camera 1-3 : +30° to +80° / Camera 4 : -15° to +80°

Notch interval : 5°




<How to adjust the inclination (YAW) angle>

Hold and move the camera unit to change the direction of each camera unit.

Camera 1-3 : ±50°


Notch interval : 5°



[5] Attach the dome cover and fix it by tighten the dome cover fixing screws (4 points) using the bit (accessory).

IMPORTANT:

- Be sure to tighten the dome cover screws in diagonal pattern. Recommended tightening torque: 1.37 N·m {1.01 lbf·ft}
- Attach the dome cover straight to the camera main unit. When it is attached inclined, the inside of the dome cover may contact the camera unit and cause deviation of the set angle of view.



[6] Remove the protection sheet from the dome cover.

[7] Connect the camera to a network by following "Configure the network settings" of the Important Information (on the provided CD-ROM).
